Dear Mr. Wade,

We are enclosing the results of the water quality monitoring performed by Environmental Monitoring & Technologies, Inc. This annual monitoring is performed to ensure that the City of Prospect Heights remains in compliance with the requirements of the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) General Stormwater Permit ILR40 for discharges from Small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4s).

The updated ILR40 Permit became effective on March 1, 2016, which requires that monitoring of storm water discharges "shall be performed within 48 hours of a precipitation event greater than or equal to one quarter inch in a 24-hour period." All water quality samples were taken after a precipitation event greater than or equal to 0.25 inches to accurately represent the pollution load from stormwater. Therefore, the tested parameters may be present in higher concentrations than in previous years' results.

Annual monitoring helps determine if the best management practices (BMPs) being performed by the City are helping to improve water quality within the receiving waters. Also enclosed is a summary report produced by Gewalt Hamilton Associates, Inc. (GHA) containing maps of the monitoring sites, a comparison between annual results, summary graphs, and BMP recommendations to improve the quality of stormwater runoff within the City.

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# Section 1 **Executive Summary**

### **BACKGROUND**

This water quality test analysis was developed for the City of Prospect Heights for the purpose of demonstrating compliance with the minimum standards required by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) General Storm Water Permit ILR40 for discharges from Small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4s). The most recent version of the ILR40 permit expired on March 31, 2014, but has been administratively continued by the IEPA. NOTE: The new updated version of the permit states that: "At a minimum, analysis shall include the following parameters: total suspended solids, total nitrogen, total phosphorus, fecal coliform, and chlorides, and oil and grease".

Test results obtained through this project were compared against the Water Quality Standards (WQS) established by the Illinois Pollution Control Board (IPCB) under Title 35 of the Illinois Administrative Code; Standard Methods for the Examination of Water and Wastewater, a joint publication of the American Public Health Association (APHA), American Water Works Association (AWWA), and the Water Environment Federation (WEF); or Volunteer Stream Monitoring: A Methods Manual, published by the United States Environmental Protection Agency, Office of Water.

Three (3) sites within the City of Prospect Heights were tested, at locations upstream and downstream of the receiving waters to which the City discharges:

- Wheeling
- Cornell
- Camp McDonald

# Section 2 Program Overview

#### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of water quality testing analysis is to demonstrate compliance with the minimum standards required by the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) General Storm Water Permit ILR40 for discharges from Small Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4s). The permit requires annual monitoring of receiving waters upstream and downstream of the MS4 discharges, use of indicators to gauge the effects of storm water discharges on the physical/habitat-related aspects of the receiving waters and/or monitoring of the effectiveness of the Best Management Practices (BMPs). MS4 components include the conveyance or system of conveyances including roads with drainage systems, municipal streets, catch basins, gutters, ditches, swales, manmade channels or storm sewers. Storm water run-off naturally contains numerous constituents; however, urbanization and urban activities (including municipal activities) typically increase concentrations to levels that may impact water quality. Pollutants associated with storm water include sediment, nutrients, bacteria and viruses, oil and grease, metals, organics, pesticides and gross pollutants.

Water pollution control programs are designed to protect the beneficial uses of the water resources within the state. Each state has the responsibility to set water quality standards (WQS) that protect these beneficial uses, commonly referred to as "designated uses". In Illinois, waters are designated for various uses including aquatic life, wildlife, agricultural use, primary contact (e.g., swimming, water skiing), secondary contact (e.g., boating, fishing), industrial use, drinking water, food-processing water supply and aesthetic quality. Illinois' WQS provide the basis for assessing whether the beneficial uses of the state's waters are being attained. The purpose of this study is to assess the quality of receiving waters and provide recommendations for BMPs that will target the identified areas of concern.

#### **TESTING METHODS AND PARAMETERS**

For proper analysis, water samples are taken at locations upstream and downstream of the MS4 discharge and kept on ice during transport to the laboratory for processing. Upstream and downstream results are compared to determine if MS4 discharges are contributing to water pollution in receiving waters.

Water quality test results are also compared against published water quality standards. The purposes of these standards are to protect existing uses of all waters of the State of Illinois, maintain above standard water quality, and prevent unnecessary deterioration of waters of the State. A majority of the standards referred to in this report have been established by the Illinois Pollution Control Board (IPCB), and can be found in the Illinois Administrative Code Title 35, Environmental Protection; Subtitle C, Water Pollution; Chapter I, Pollution Control Board; Part 302, Water Quality Standards, or Part 304, Effluent Standards
(http://www.ipcb.state.il.us/SLR/IPCBandIEPAEnvironmentalRegulations-Title35.asp).

The IPCB has not established standards for one of the parameters measured (Total Kjeldahl Nitrogen). For purposes of this report, the standards for these parameters have been established as follows:

 Total Kjeldahl Nitrogen – As published in Standard Methods for the Examination of Water and Wastewater, a joint publication of the American Public Health Association (APHA), American Water Works Association (AWWA), and the Water Environment Federation (WEF) (<a href="http://www.standardmethods.org/">http://www.standardmethods.org/</a>).

# Section 3 **Testing Locations**

In the City of Prospect Heights, three (3) sites were selected for testing:

## 1. Wheeling

This test site is located on Wheeling road nearly directly between where the road intersects with Woodcreek Road and Kenilworth Avenue (I.E. equidistant from both). The sample was taken on the South side of the stream there approximately forty feet to the West of the point where it passes beneath Wheeling Road. In this report, the site is considered a downstream location to the Cornell and Camp McDonald sites.


#### 2. Cornell

This test site is located on N. Cornell Road almost directly between where the road intersects with Harbour Drive and Creekside Street. The sample was taken from the stream there approximately twenty feet to the East of where the stream passes beneath Cornell Road. In this report, the site is considered an upstream location for the Des Plaines River.


## 3. Camp McDonald


This test site is located just north of Camp McDonald Road to the West of where the road intersects with Elm Street. The sample was taken from the inlet on the Southwestern corner of the detention basin bisecting the baseball fields there. In this report, the site is considered an upstream location for the Des Plaines River.

# Section 4 Results and Recommendations

#### **TEST RESULTS**

Test results were reviewed to detect changes between upstream and downstream sampling points and also against generally accepted standards. The results of the water quality testing indicate that the majority of parameters were within the Water Quality Standards (WQS) limit for the Coty of Prospect Heights. A summary table of all results is located in the Appendix. See pages 5-7 above for further description of the tested parameters.

The following table summarizes only the parameters which were above the accepted limits:

This analysis is in no way intended to identify violations of the IPCB Standards.

#### **POTENTIAL CAUSES**

Fecal coliform levels are high at two out of three sites. Fecal coliform does not pose a threat to humans unless ingested. However, extremely high levels could indicate a problem with local sewage treatment plants or pipes that carry the water. The levels of fecal coliform present here may be attributed to geese or other animals. The Comell site and the Wheeling site are both located downstream of a series of detention ponds. Geese tend to populate ponds and lakes with clean, unvegetated shorelines, which could contribute to this high fecal colifor level.

Total phosphorus levels are high at two out of three sites. The main source of excess phosphorous is fertilizer, pesticides and insecticides used on lawns in residential and commercial areas, as well as household and commercial detergents and cleansers. Pollution from fertilizer can be reduced by changing the type or amount of fertilizer used in residential and commercial areas.

#### **BEST MANAGEMENT PRACTICES**

The City of Prospect Heights can work with upstream communities and users to find solutions for reducing stormwater pollution sources. We recommend using stormwater BMPs as outlined in the City's <u>Stormwater Management Program Plan (SMPP)</u> in order to reduce adverse effects of stormwater runoff on the City's water quality.


Additional educational materials to increase public awareness of pollution sources and ways to reduce these are critical to cooperative reduction in pollutants into the environment. Understanding sources of pollutants including pet waste, detergents and cleansers, fertilizers and pesticides will help residents, commercial and industry make informed choices. Supplying ideas on ways to reduce these problems and enforcing them will assist in long term reductions.


For residents, these include using native landscape plantings, rain gardens, rain barrels, reducing fertilizers and lawn watering, and reducing de-icing materials. Fertilizers should not be applied on lawns prior to a large precipitation event. Lake County promotes a P-Free Fertilizer Initiative to reduce the use of phosphorus for residential land use. Residents along the creek can incorporate natural shorelines including stone re-facing or filter strips instead of seawalls, to prevent shoreline erosion, absorb wave energy and provide aquatic habitat.


For commercial, office and industrial, reducing de-icing salts or use of alternative materials, native landscaping, reducing or eliminating irrigation, using grey water, incorporating bioswales, rain gardens, filter strips, encouraging carpooling are ways to reduce pollutants.


Lastly, the City should continue to compare water quality test results each year to determine if the BMPs performed by the City are improving water quality in the receiving waters within the City of Prospect Heights.













Total Kjeldahl Nitrogen mg/L



ISSUE:

Plaza Drive reconstruction update

BACKGROUND: In the spring, the Building Department placedthe owners of the seven (7) properties that own Plaza Drive, a private road, on notice of violation for deteriorated property conditions for Plaza Drive. The City gave notice of violation to the owners regarding the deteriorated condition of their private road. Six of the owners are part of the Country Pines Association and the other owner is Pabcor, owner of Palwaukee Plaza.

As you are aware, staff has been trying to facilitate a mutually negotiated resolution for the reconstruction of Plaza Drive between the owners of Country Pines Association and Pabcor. Country Pines has been cooperating and meeting with City staff and engineer to present a proposal that meets the City road construction standards, with the eventual outcome of dedicating the road to the City in the future. Marty Rayyan, President of Country Pines presented a project estimate to the City, which complied with City street reconstruction requirements. However, he did not obtain cooperation from the representatives of Pabcor to share the costs of the repairs.

The City then coordinated a series of meetings with the owners of Pabcor, Country Pines and the City. Staff updated council of the outcome of the first meeting and Council directed staff to continue to work on a negotiated solution, with the City participating in the effort by providing legal and plat work to facilitate the dedication of the road, not to exceed \$20,000. City staff coordinated another meeting of the parties on September 25 2017. Staff presented the options to the owners for consideration. Country Pines restated their commitment to the plan and their estimate for the work. Pabcor indicated that they were going to review the estimate provided and get cost comparisons and get back with the City in a couple of weeks.

On September 28, 2017, I provided Pabcor with the specifications for road construction that would meet City requirements for dedication. Mr. Arvanitis, Pabcor, indicated that he would get back with me after he obtained his cost estimates. I reached out and left messages at the end of October and early November requesting a status up date. On November 15 2017, I received an email from and also spoke with Mr. Arvanitis who indicated that Pabcor was still in process of getting information, and would need to speak with the owner the next week. I left a voicemail last week and an email on Monday December 4, 2017. As of today, I have not received a response to my messages.

Due to the lateness of the season this project will not be completed this year.

into the required 5' Side Yard Setback.

Please be advised that Joe Pascucci, owner of the subject property, originally was seeking a variation to Section 5-6-1 E (3) of the City of Prospect Heights Zoning Code to allow the reduction of the required interior yard setback from 15" to 2' along the east side of his property for the purpose of constructing an addition onto the primary structure. After three continuances, considerable engineering and design work, the applicant requested to amend his variation request to allow a driveway encroachment into the required side yard on the west side of the property. This change is a result of exploring alternative solutions and to accommodate moving his garage from the east side of the property to the west, lessoning the impact to his neighbor to the east.

After consultation with the City Attorney, it was confirmed that there was no need to re-notice the public hearing as the variation request is lesser in scope than the original application.

On August 24, 2017 the PZBA held a public hearing to consider a Zoning Variation request to allow the construction of a driveway 4' into the required 5' side yard setback per section 5-8-2E of the City of Prospect Heights Zoning Code to provide access the rear yard to allow the construction of a detached garage.

Testimony provided by the applicants architect called for a 720 sq. ft. code compliant detached garage to be constructed in the rear yard with an access driveway constructed on the west part of the property. The new driveway will encroach 4' into the into the required 5' side yard setback. The stated hardship for the variation is that the area around the house is in the 100 year flood plain with only the minimum required 15' side yard setback along the west side of the property.

The applicant's engineer, Mark Toberman, testified that the driveway design met the engineering requirements for the required compensatory storm water storage on site. The project architect

Mike Aiello, testified that the architectural plans comply with the City of Prospect Heights Flood Control Ordinance Title 7 and FEMA's standards for flood resistant construction.

City Engineer John Briggs reviewed the documents and concluded that the project did not require a variation to Title 7: Flood Control Ordinance of the City of Prospect Heights Municipal Code.

Testimony was provided by Mr. Tomasz Wadowski, 699 Glendale Dr., Prospect Heights, IL. Mr. Wodowski stated that he did not mind the garage and driveway on the west side of the property, but his main concern was that there would be no parking of the tow truck as original indicated by the applicant. His attorney, Daniel Dowd, restated the concern that tow truck parking was not permitted in the R1 Single Family District.

Chairman Dash and Director Peterson confirmed that vehicles over 12,001 GVW are not permitted in the R1 District by City Code. The applicant has been fully informed and is aware of this restriction.

The City Council should request that the applicant clearly identify what type of vehicle will be stored in the detached garage. The original request was for the purpose of parking his tow truck in the garage. Be advised that the tow truck is a commercial vehicle which exceeds 12,000 GVW and is not allowed to be parked or stored in a residential district per Section 5-8-2A3.

The PZBA considered all the documentation and testimony and after deliberation voted 4-0 to recommend to the City Council approval of the variation to Section 8-5-2E to allow a 4' encroachment into the required 5' side yard set back.

Recommendation: First Reading of Ordinance #0-17-22.

### ORDINANCE NO. O-17-22

### AN ORDINANCE GRANTING CERTAIN VARIATIONS FOR THE PROPERTY AT 697 GLENDALE DRIVE, PROSPECT HEIGHTS, ILLINOIS







This tax is levied pursuant to Chapter 108-1/2, Illinois Compiled Statutes, Sec. 3-125 and pursuant to Ordinance 0-90-34, "An Ordinance Relating to the Police Pension Fund for the City of Prospect Heights, Illinois."

### Section 4. Filing.

There is hereby certified to the County Clerk of Cook County, Illinois the sum aforesaid, constituting the total amount the said City of Prospect Heights Police Pension Fund requires to be raised for the current fiscal year, and the City Clerk is hereby directed to file with the County Clerk of Cook County on or before the time required by law, a certified copy of this ordinance.

#### Purpose:

It is the responsibility of the State's Attorney's Office (SAO) to prosecute Illinois Vehicle Code violations; the Cook County State's Attorney has issued directives to their staff not to prosecute certain violations of the IVC.

Encapsulating the entire IVC as a Municipal Ordinance will allow the City Prosecutor to address these offenses and more.

#### Financial Impact:

Prosecuting traffic offenses as an Ordinance Violations should theoretically allow the City a higher percentage of fines than what is currently received.

#### Recommendation:

Adopt the Illinois Vehicle Code as a Municipal Ordinance

## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 10 OF THE CITY OF PROSPECT HEIGHTS CITY CODE ADOPTING THE ILLINOIS VEHICLE CODE

**SECTION ONE:** That Title 10 of the Prospect Heights City Code is hereby amended with additions shown in bold, underlined text and deletions in strikethrough text so that the same shall be read as follows:

#### 10-16 ILLINOIS VEHICLE CODE

#### 10-16-1: Adopted By Reference; Citations

- A. In lieu of using any section, or in addition to any section of this title, the officer issuing a citation may issue it by using any of the sections of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/1-100 et seq.), except any offense under the Illinois Vehicle Code or a similar offense that is a traffic regulation governing the movement of vehicles other than for any reportable offense under section 6-204 of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/1-100 et seq.), which sections of the Illinois Vehicle Code, and all amendments made from time to time, are adopted and incorporated by reference as part of this title.
- B. Penalties. The penalty for violation of any provision of the Illinois Vehicle Code adopted by reference in subsection A of this section shall be the penalty specified for the violation by the Illinois Vehicle Code. Where the Illinois Vehicle Code does not provide a specific penalty for the violation, the penalty shall be a fine of not to exceed two hundred dollars (\$200.00).

**SECTION TWO:** That the City Clerk of the City of Prospect Heights be and is directed hereby to publish this Ordinance in pamphlet form, pursuant to the Statutes of the State of Illinois, made and provided.

#### **Background**

At the November 27 City Council Meeting, Mayor and Council discussed the special event liquor license fees, with direction to City Attorney Kevin Kearney to draft an ordinance amending the fee for special event liquor licenses, from the present \$100 to \$1,000. Attached is the City Attorney's ordinance.

Special event liquor licenses are available to holders of Class A and Class C licenses and provide for additional hours for specific events. Class A and Class C liquor license holders are limited to three special events per year, and must be applied for by the licensee. This fee is separate from the license holder's annual license fee.

#### **Analysis**

Special events might include additional hours for such holidays as New Year's Eve, Saint Patrick's Day and others, or to provide additional hours for specific shows/events as may be held at local establishments.

# ORDINANCE NO. O-17-34 An Ordinance Amending Title 2 of the Prospect Heights City Code (Chapter 3 - Liquor Control)

Requests for the permit for modified hours shall be made to the local liquor control commissioner in writing, signed by the applicant, including name of responsible supervisor to the special event, client for whom the special event will be held and any other information deemed necessary by the local liquor control commissioner. Each application for a permit for modified hours shall include a nonrefundable fee of one hundred thousand dollars (\$1000.00) which shall be separate and distinct from the annual license fee.
