




City of Prospect Heights Financial Report – FY17-18 For the Eight Months Ended December 31, 2017

The following report highlights the financial position of the City of Prospect Heights for the period beginning May 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017 (8 months ~ 67% of year) with an analysis on actual revenues and expenditures compared to fiscal year 2017/2018 budget.

Overall Fund Summary - The following charts highlight each of the City's major funds and how the YTD revenues and expenditures compare to budget:







Revenue and Expenditures - By Fund

As detailed in the following table on pg. 3-4, most of the funds revenue and expense are in line with the current period (67% of the year has elapsed). The following budget variances are worth noting:

- General Fund Expenses across all departments have been monitored closely to capitalize on lower costs and efficiencies where possible. The chart below shows departmental expenses as a % of current budget:
- <u>Palatine/Milwaukee TIF Fund</u> There has been a significant increase in property taxes collected over previous year (\$674,153 v. \$205,558 in FY17). Expenses include the principal and interest payment (\$524,000) on the debt which represents the final payment of that issue.
- <u>SSA 6 Debt Fund</u> Property tax revenues appear to be lower than expected, however, we are consistent with collections at this same time last year. We anticipate March, 2018 will bring in remaining amounts within budget. Expenses for the year include payment of principal and interest (\$238,502) for this year.
- Road Construction Debt Fund Principal and interest (\$1,312,535) has been paid.
- Parking Fund The parking continues to operate at a deficit as expenses of \$54,265 exceed actual revenue of \$42,495 for the eight months ending December 31, 2017. This deficit of (\$11,770) includes an administrative service charge of \$20,667. The administrative service charge was budgeted in FY17-18 for a total of \$31,000. For the FY18-19 budget, this service will be eliminated.



General Fund Summary


At December 31, 2017, the City's General Fund actual revenues of \$5,879,185 were \$725,932 in excess of the actual expenses of \$5,153,253. In the prior fiscal year, the revenues were \$816,598 in excess of the expenses. The budget-to-actual comparison indicates that revenues collected are 65.36% of budgeted revenues while actual expenditures are 52.82% of budgeted expenditures.

Major Revenues


Property Taxes - The City has collected 68% or \$1,953,400 of the budgeted property taxes. This amount also includes \$10,187 of budgeted property taxes for Road & Bridge in the General Fund. The first installment of property taxes is expected to be received this spring.



Sales Taxes – Year to date sales taxes of \$859,064 are currently trending slightly higher than the same month last year, and are higher than the target with the 67% of current budget of \$753,935. The following bar graph depicts the amount collected on a monthly basis in Fiscal Year 2018 in comparison to the same month in prior Fiscal Year 2016 and 2017.




Income Taxes — As of December 31, 2017, income tax revenue of \$1,191,653 is 72.6% of budget, which is above target with the 67% of current budget of \$1,100,043. As part of the State of Illinois budget agreement municipalities are expected to see a 10% reduction in Local Government Distributive Fund (LGDF) revenue this year. The City of Prospect Heights will see a shortfall in this revenue source of approximately \$150,000.



Enterprise Funds


Water Fund

Water fund revenue is budgeted at \$865,134 for the entire fiscal year. Through December 31, 2017 the actual revenues are \$567,556 or 65.6% of budget compared to \$561,933 or 68.9% of budget for the same eight month period last year. Water fund actual expenditures through December total \$568,218 or 49.95% of budget compared to \$503,233 or 66.2% of the budget for the same eight month period last year.



Sewer Fund

Sewer fund revenue is budgeted at \$673,125 for the entire fiscal year. Through December 31, 2017 the actual revenues are \$385,485 or 57.2% of budget compared to \$114,210 or 44.7% of budget for the same eight month period last year. Sewer fund actual expenditures through December total \$188,717 or 20.4% of budget compared to \$173,489 or 23.5% of the budget for the same eight month period last year.

- 3. Palatine / Milwaukee TIF Repayment of inter fund loan to the general fund (\$1,019,000)
- 4. Solid waste fund- Annual service charge and Existing Fund Balance
- 5. Elimination of 95% of the existing service charges in proposed budget
- 6. Increase in water Rates- Calculation of the rate and inclusion in the budget
- 7. Funding Capital Program going forward

I will be present at the Council meeting on February 12th to discuss each of the issues with you. Our work on the budget to date has been very enlightening and your input on these issues will provide direction in balancing the upcoming budget and strategy for funding the capital program.

ORDINANCE NO. O-18-An Ordinance Amending Title 2 of the Prospect Heights City Code (Chapter 3 – Liquor Control)

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PROSPECT HEIGHTS, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS as follows:

<u>Section 1.</u> That Title 2, Business & License Regulation, Chapter 3, Liquor Control, Section 2-3-2, Local Liquor Control Commissioner, of the Prospect Heights City Code, as amended, is hereby further amended with deletions in strikethrough and additions in bold underline text so that the same shall be read as follows:

2-3-2: LOCAL LIQUOR CONTROL COMMISSIONER:

The mayor of the city shall be the local liquor control commissioner and shall be charged with the administration within the city of the appropriate provisions of the state and of this chapter. He may appoint a person or persons to assist him in the exercise of the powers and the performance of the duties of said office. The city council may fix and pay compensation to the local liquor control commissioner of the city and compensation to such deputies, assistants or employees as may be deemed necessary for the proper performance of the duties vested in him. The Local Liquor Control Commissioner shall have the following powers, functions and duties with respect to licenses, other than licenses to manufacturers, importing distributors, distributors, nonbeverage users, railroads, airplanes and boats:

F. To levy fines in accordance with Section 2-3-24 of this Chapter. In addition to a fine, the licensee shall be subject to the cost incurred by the City for a hearing on any violation. These costs shall include, but not limited to court reporter, witness expenses, expert or scientific analysis, and any other charges attendant to said hearing.

<u>Section 2.</u> That Title 2, Business & License Regulation, Chapter 3, Liquor Control, Section 2-3-4, Application for License, of the Prospect Heights City Code, as amended, is hereby further amended with deletions in strikethrough and additions in bold underline text so that the same shall be read as follows:

2-3-4: LOCAL LIQUOR CONTROL COMMISSIONER:

Applications for new and renewed licenses shall be made to the Mayor in writing, signed by the applicant or applicants, if an individual or individuals, or by a duly authorized agent thereof, if a club or corporation, and certified before a notary public verified by eath or, affidavit. All applications shall be accompanied by a nonrefundable application

fee of one <u>two</u> hundred dollars (\$1200.00) which shall be separate and distinct from the annual license fee. New applications shall contain the following statements and information:

- H. A statement that the applicant will not violate any of the laws of the State, or of the United States, or any ordinance of the City in the conduct of his place of business.
- I. The amount of goods, wares and merchandise on hand at the time the application is made or, equivalently, the monetary value of current inventory.
- JI. Any other information or guarantees that the Local Liquor Control Commissioner or the City authorities shall require.

Prior to the issuance of a City of Prospect Heights Liquor License, evidence of Dram Shop Insurance of an amount and character which shall be a minimum amount sufficient to satisfy all statutory requirements and applications as determined by the Local Liquor Commissioner. This insurance shall remain in force during the period for which the license is issued. The lapse of this insurance shall constitute grounds for revocation of the license. For purposes of this Section, a Certificate of Insurance in the form approved by the city attorney shall be deemed adequate evidence of insurance.

Applications for renewal shall contain either a statement that all of the above statements and information are and remain true and valid, or appropriate statements describing any changes in or to any such information or statements contained in the original or any previous application. Each renewal application shall, however, require reaffirmation of the type and division of ownership contained in subsection A of this Section and of the intent of each applicant to comply with subsection H of this Section.

<u>Section 3.</u> That Title 2, Business & License Regulation, Chapter 3, Liquor Control, Section 2-3-8, Classification of Licenses, of the Prospect Heights City Code, as amended, is hereby further amended with deletions in strikethrough and additions in bold underline text so that the same shall be read as follows:

2-3-8: CLASSIFICATION OF LICENSES:

A. Class A Licenses: Class A licenses which shall authorize the retail sale on the premises of specified of alcoholic liquor only for consumption on the premises of restaurants and hotels.

Class A licenses shall authorize the retail sale of alcoholic liquor in restaurants and hotels only, for consumption on the premises where sold. If the premises is a

hotel, packaged liquor may be sold to guests of the hotel. For restaurants, such licenses may be issued and retained by those establishments which:

- Have a seating capacity at tables for a minimum of thirty (30) persons for food services; and
- Offer their patrons meals.

Other than hotels, no such license shall be granted to or retained by any establishment in which the facilities for food preparation and service are not primarily those of a restaurant. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, limited food service, such as provided by lounges, luncheonettes, diners, coffee shops, drive-ins, etc., do not satisfy the requirements for this license classification.

Class A 1 Licenses: Class A 1 licenses shall authorize the retail sales on the premises of beer and wine only for consumption on the premises in a bowling alley only.

Class A-2 Late-Hour 2 Licenses: Class A-2 licenses shall authorize the retail sale on the premises specified of alcoholic liquor only for consumption on the premises.

Class Late-Hour 2 licenses shall duplicate Class A licenses in all regards, except that Class Late-Hour 2 licenses shall permit the sale of alcoholic liquor until 2:00 am the following day. The holder of a Class A license may petition the local liquor commissioner for a Late-Hour 2 permit, which shall be granted in the sole discretion of the local liquor commissioner.

Class A 3 Class Late-Hour 4 Licenses: Class A 3 licenses shall authorize the retail sale on the premises specified of alcoholic liquor only for consumption on the premises during the hours set forth in section 2 3-9 of this chapter. The holder of a class A 3 A 2 license may petition the local liquor commissioner for a temporary extended hours permit to allow extended hours not later than four o'clock (4:00) A.M. on any one day Sunday through Thursday. Said petition must be in writing and delivered to the local liquor commissioner not less than fourteen (14) days prior to the date on which the licensee desires extended hours. An extended hours permit granted under this section shall be valid only for the single date specified on the permit. Extended hours under this subsection may be granted in the sole discretion of the local liquor commissioner and shall not be deemed a right of the licensee.

Class Late-Hour 4 licenses shall duplicate Class A licenses in all regards, except that Class Late-Hour 2 licenses shall permit the sale of alcoholic liquor until 4:00 am the following day. No new Late Hour-4 licenses shall be issued to any individual, corporation, or partnership other than those holding such licenses as of [Insert Date], and such may be renewed for on the business currently using that license. At such time as any current holder of such license surrenders it or fails to renew it, or it is revoked or renewal denied, the number of Class A-2 licenses permitted shall be reduced accordingly.

Class A 4 Licenses: Class A 4 licenses shall duplicate Class A licenses in all regards except for hours of operation.

B. Class B Licenses: Class B licenses which shall authorize the retail sale of alcoholic liquor, but not for consumption on the premises where sold.

If said sale of alcoholic liquor is carried out on premises which are utilized primarily for other retail sales activities, the sale of such liquor shall be confined to an area which is separated from the other retail sales activity.

The sale of such liquor shall be confined to an area which is separated from the other retail portions of the premises by a suitable enclosure or partition of such design and construction as may be approved by the local liquor control commissioner. No class B license outstanding on the effective date of this section shall be renewed upon its expiration unless such approved enclosure or partition has been constructed.

C. Class B-1, B-2, And B-3 Licenses:

- Class B-1 Licenses: Class B-1 licenses which shall authorize the retail sale of wine and beer, but not for consumption on the premises where sold. The said sale of alcoholic liquor is carried out on premises which are used primarily for the sale at retail of packaged foods and/or convenience items to be carried out from the premises.
- 2. Class B-2 Licenses: Class B-2 licenses which shall authorize the retail sale of wine and beer, but not for consumption on premises where sold. The said sale of alcoholic liquor is carried out on premises which are used primarily for the sale at retail of packaged foods and/or convenience items to be carried out from the premises, during hours of operation which differ from the B-1 classification.
- 3. Class B-3 Licenses—Grocery Stores: Class B-3 licenses which shall authorize the retail sale of alcoholic liquor by grocery stores not for consumption on the premises where sold. The said sale of alcoholic liquor is carried out on premises which are used primarily for the sale of groceries and related goods to be carried out from the premises.
- 4. Separate Area For Sales: If said sale of alcoholic liquor, wine or beer is carried out on premises which are utilized primarily for other retail sales activities, the sale of such liquor shall be confined to an area which is separated from the other retail sales activity. The sale of such wine or beer shall be confined to an area which is separated from the other retail portions of the premises by a suitable enclosure or partition of such design and construction as may be approved by the local liquor control commissioner. No class B-1 or B-2, or B-3 license outstanding on the effective date of this section shall be renewed upon its expiration unless such approved enclosure or partition has been constructed.

- D. Class C Licenses: Class C licenses which shall authorize the retail sale, in restaurants only, of alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises where sold. Such licenses may be issued to and retained by those establishments which:
 - 1. Have a seating capacity at tables for a minimum of thirty (30) persons for food services; and
 - 2. Offer their patrons full and complete meals, including a dinner menu.

No such license shall be granted to or retained by any establishment in which the facilities for food preparation and service are not primarily those of a restaurant or are operated as a "fast food restaurant" as defined in this chapter. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, limited food service, such as provided by lounges, luncheonettes, diners, coffee shops, drive-ins, etc., do not satisfy the requirements for this license classification.

- E. Class C-1 Licenses: Class C-1 licenses which shall authorize the retail sale of wine and beer in restaurants only, for consumption on the premises where sold. Such licenses may be issued and retained by those establishments which:
 - 1. Have a seating capacity at tables for a minimum of thirty (30) persons for food services; and
 - 2. Offer their patrons meals.

No such license shall be granted to or retained by any establishment in which the facilities for food preparation and service are not primarily those of a restaurant.

- F. Class C-2 Licenses: Class C-2 licenses which shall authorize the retail sale of alcoholic liquor in restaurants only, without a bar or cocktail lounge area for consumption on the premises where sold. Such licenses may be issued and retained by those establishments which:
 - 1. Are located within the boundaries of the area commonly referred to as the Prospect Crossing TIF area and have a square footage of not less than seven thousand (7,000) square feet; and
 - 2. Meet all the requirements set forth in subsection D of this section for class C licenses.
- G. Class C-3 Licenses: Class C-3 licenses be the same as class C-1 licenses in all respects except for the hours of operation which shall be as set forth in section 2-3-9 of this chapter.
- H. Class D Licenses: Class D licenses which shall authorize the retail sale of alcoholic liquor for consumption on public golf course premises.

I. Daily Permits: The local liquor control commissioner may grant a daily permit which shall authorize the retail sale of alcoholic liquors for consumption only on the premises where sold, to any company, organization or group, authorizing the sale of alcoholic liquor at any picnic, carnival or similar function given by said organization.

Daily permits may be issued for not more than five (5) consecutive days to any one organization. The application for a daily permit shall specify the name of the organization, the person or persons responsible for custody and sale of alcoholic beverages, the dates, and hours of service, and shall indicate the nature of the organization (e.g., charitable, civic) and the character of the event or events to which the permit applies. No such permits, however, shall be issued or granted except upon proof of adequate dramshop (host liquor liability) insurance provided by the insurance carrier or a bona fide agent of the carrier.

Prior to the issuance of a daily permit to any applicant, such applicant shall place on deposit with the local liquor control commissioner the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) to one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), the exact amount to be determined by the local liquor control commissioner for each day of the event for which a permit is required. At the discretion of the local liquor control commissioner, such deposit shall be refundable to such applicant provided that the event for which the daily permit was issued, was conducted without justifiable complaints from nearby residents and without disruption of nearby business activities or traffic flow. No such deposit shall be refunded in the event that any violation of this section occurred at the event for which the daily permit was issued.

- J. Special Permits: The local liquor control commissioner may grant modified hours for special events with no more than three (3) such permits to be approved per applicant per year. Such special permits shall be restricted to holders of class A and class C licenses. Requests for the permit for modified hours shall be made to the local liquor control commissioner in writing, signed by the applicant, including name of responsible supervisor to the special event, client for whom the special event will be held and any other information deemed necessary by the local liquor control commissioner. Each application for a permit for modified hours shall include a nonrefundable fee of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) which shall be separate and distinct from the annual license fee.
- K. Sunday Brunch Permits: The local liquor control commissioner may grant to holders of class A and class C licenses a special Sunday brunch SB permit to serve alcoholic beverages on Sundays between the hours of nine c'clock (9:00) A.M. and twelve c'clock (12:00) noon. The SB permit shall be an addendum to the annual license; and, in no way, shall it be regarded as a license. Holders of such permits shall pay the fees established in section 2-3-9 of this chapter.

The SB permits shall be effective and concurrent with the licenses to which they apply. No such permit shall be valid in the absence of or during the revocation or suspension of the license to which it applies.

SB permits shall be issued subject to the same rules and restrictions with respect to holder qualifications, terms and conditions, and to the general requirements of this chapter which apply to the licenses. Additional restrictions are as follows:

- 1. SB permits shall apply only to the service of alcoholic beverages at the licensed establishment.
- 2. All licensed establishments holding an SB permit may provide additional alcoholic beverage service during the period between the hours of nine o'clock (9:00) A.M. and twelve o'clock (12:00) noon on Sundays only in connection with meal service.

No person or persons shall be served alcoholic beverages in any area where meal service is not offered and available, and no person or persons shall consume alcoholic beverages during such period except in connection with a meal.

3. Service of alcoholic beverages under the SB permit is strictly prohibited in cocktail lounges, bar areas, coffee shops and other rooms or areas where complete meals are not offered and served.

<u>Section 4.</u> That Title 2, Business & License Regulation, Chapter 3, Liquor Control, Section 2-3-9, Licenses; Classes, Fees, Limitations on Number and Hours of Operation, of the Prospect Heights City Code, as amended, is stricken in its entirety and amended so that the same shall be read as follows:

2-3-9: LICENSES; CLASSES, FEES, LIMITATIONS ON NUMBER AND HOURS OF OPERATION:

 be renewed for on the business currently using that license. At such time as any
 current holder of such license surrenders it or fails to renew it, or it is revoked or
 renewal denied, the number of Class A-2 licenses permitted shall be reduced
 accordingly.
- 2. Daily liquor license deposit may be refunded subject to discretion of local liquor control commissioner per subsection 2-3-8 of this chapter.

<u>Section 5.</u> That Title 2, Business & License Regulation, Chapter 3, Liquor Control, Section 2-3-13, Conditions of License, of the Prospect Heights City Code, as amended, is hereby further amended with deletions in strikethrough and additions in bold underline text so that the same shall be read as follows:

2-3-9: CONDITIONS OF LICENSE:

G. Minimum Size Of Container For Unmixed Whiskey, Gin Or Rum: No unmixed whiskey, gin or unmixed rum shall be sold or offered for sale or at retail for consumption on the premises, except in a container having a minimum capacity of at least one fluid ounce and which contains at the time of sale at least one fluid ounce of the of the beverage being sold.

H. Happy Hours Prohibited:

- 1. All retail licenses shall maintain a schedule of the prices charged for all drinks of alcoholic liquor to be served and consumed on the licensed premises or in any room or part thereof. Whenever a hotel or multiuse establishment which holds a valid retailer's license operates on its premises more than one establishment at which drinks of alcoholic liquor are sold at retail, the hotel or multiuse establishment shall maintain at each such establishment a separate schedule of the prices charged for such drinks at that establishment.
- 2. No retail licensee or employee or agent of such licensee shall:
 - a. Serve two (2) or more drinks of alcoholic liquor at one time to one person for consumption by that person, except selling or delivering wine by the bottle or carafe;
 - b. Sell, offer to sell or serve to any person an unlimited number of drinks of alcoholic liquor during any set period of time for a fixed price, except at private functions not open to the general public;
 - e. Sell, offer to sell or serve any drink of alcoholic liquor to any person on any one date at a reduced price other than that charged other purchasers of drinks on that day where such reduced price is a promotion to encourage consumption of alcoholic liquor, except as authorized in subsection H3g of this section;
 - dc. Increase the volume of alcoholic liquor contained in a drink, or the size of a drink of alcoholic liquor, without increasing proportionately the price regularly charged for the drink on that day;
 - ed. Encourage or permit, on the licensed premises, any game or contest which involves drinking alcoholic liquor or the awarding of drinks of alcoholic liquor as prizes for such game or contest on the licensed premises; or
 - fe. Advertise or promote in any way, whether on or off the licensed premises, any of the practices prohibited under subsections H2b through H2e of this section.

- 3. Nothing in subsection H2 of this section shall be construed to prohibit a licensee from:
 - a. Offering free food or entertainment at any time;
 - b. Including drinks of alcoholic liquor as part of a meal package;
 - c. Including drinks of alcoholic liquor as part of a hotel package;
 - d. Negotiating drinks of alcoholic liquor as part of a contract between a hotel or multiuse establishment and another group for the holding of any function, meeting, convention or trade show;
 - e. Providing room service to persons renting rooms at a hotel;
 - f. Selling pitchers (or the equivalent, including, but not limited to, buckets), carafes, or bottles of alcoholic liquor which are customarily sold in such manner and delivered to two (2) or more persons at one time; or
 - g. Increasing prices of drinks of alcoholic liquor in lieu of, in whole or in part, a cover charge to offset the cost of special entertainment not regularly scheduled.
- I. Books And Records: It shall be the duty of every retail licensee to make books and records available upon reasonable notice for the purpose of investigation and control by the local liquor control commissioner. Such books and records need not be maintained on the licensed premises, but it must be maintained in the state.
- J. Duty To Report Certain Illicit Activity: All licensees and their agents and employees shall have the affirmative duty to report the following activity at the licensed premises to the Prospect Heights police: fights, violence, transaction and use of illegal substances and drug paraphernalia, gang activity, prostitution, the presence of firearms or the unlawful use thereof, or any activity which results in a breach of the peace.
- K. Duty To Cooperate With Law Enforcement Personnel: All licensees and their agents and employees shall have the affirmative duty to cooperate with law enforcement personnel in their investigation of crime and enforcement of state law and Prospect Heights ordinances.

<u>Section 6.</u> That Title 2, Business & License Regulation, Chapter 3, Liquor Control, Section 2-3-22, Alcohol Awareness Training Requirements, of the Prospect Heights City Code, as amended, is hereby stricken in its entirety and replaced with the following bold underline text so that the same shall be read as follows:

2-3-22: ALCOHOL AWARENESS TRAINING REQUIREMENTS:

Any person that delivers, serves or pours alcoholic beverages and all managers and supervisors of a licensed premises must provide proof of having completed a certified alcohol awareness training course within one hundred twenty (120) days of being hired. This regulation shall not apply to duly issued ad hoc permits if the requirement is specifically waived by the Liquor Commissioner.

A. Training Program. Training is required as specified below:

- 1. The original or renewal application for a class A, C, or D license(consumption on premises shall be accompanied with proof of completion of a state-certified and City Police Department-approved beverage alcohol sellers and servers education and training program (BASSET), for all persons who serve or sell alcoholic beverages pursuant to that license.
- 2. The original or renewal application for a class A, C, or D license shall be accompanied with proof of completion of a state-certified and City Police Department-approved beverage alcohol sellers and servers education and training program (BASSET) for the manager of the licensee.
- 3. All persons who serve or sell alcoholic liquor shall, prior to serving or selling any alcoholic liquor within the City, register for a City Police Department-approved BASSET training course. Course to be completed within 90 days of employment with establishment. Registration of employees is the responsibility of the licensee.
- 4. All persons who serve or sell alcoholic liquor, including the manager of every licensee, shall within 90 days from the beginning of their employment with that licensee, complete a police approved BASSET training program, and shall until completion of the BASSET program, work under the supervision of a person who has completed the BASSET program.
- 5. A photocopy of the certificate of completion of the BASSET program will be maintained in the manager's office on the premises of the licensee. All A, C, or D license holders must maintain a list of employees who have obtained BASSET certification, which must be available on demand for inspection by the City of Prospect Heights Police Department.
- 6. Employees of liquor license establishments that are of a 'temporary status" (Christmas, summer help, etc.) whose employment does not extend past ninety (90) days from the date of employment are not required to complete the training program but must, for the duration of their employment, work under the immediate supervision of a person

who has completed the BASSET training program. Proof of employment hiring date to be exhibited upon demand of a City police officer or other agent authorized by the Liquor Commissioner. "Temporary status" sellers and servers must also contact the City Police Department to advise of name, establishment and hiring date prior to selling or serving alcohol within the City. Responsibility for registration of all "temporary status" employees rests with the licensee.

- B. Service, sale and management without required training prohibited. It shall be unlawful to permit any person in a class A,C, or D licensed establishment to serve or sell alcoholic beverages unless that person has completed a City Police Department-approved BASSET training program as required by this section or employ a manager in a Class A, C, or D licensed establishment unless that person has completed City Police Department-approved BASSET training program as required in subsection (A) of this section.
- C. Repeating Course. In addition to other penalties imposed in this chapter, a person violating any regulation of this chapter may be required to again complete BASSET training program as required in this section.

<u>Section 7.</u> That Title 2, Business & License Regulation, Chapter 3, Liquor Control, Section 2-3-23, Revocation, Suspension of License, of the Prospect Heights City Code, as amended, is hereby with deletions in strikethrough and additions in bold underline text so that the same shall be read as follows:

2-3-22: REVOCATION, SUSPENSION OF LICENSE:

All appeals to the state liquor control commission by a city liquor licensee of a decision, order of action by the local liquor control commissioner or designee, having the effect of fining a licensee, suspending or revoking the city liquor license shall be limited to review of the official record of the formal proceedings before the commissioner.

The Mayor may suspend for not more than thirty (30) days or revoke for cause any liquor dealer's license for any violation of any provision pertaining to the sale of alcoholic liquor, as provided and in the manner provided in 235 Illinois Compiled Statutes 5/7-5. In addition, the Mayor may revoke for cause any liquor dealer's license for violations of federal, state and local ordinance and law, including but not limited to all Village Ordinances and the Liquor Control Act of 1934 (235 ILCS 5/1-1 et al.).

When any license shall have been revoked for any cause, the licensee of the affected establishment shall not be granted a license for the period of one year thereafter for the conduct of the business of selling alcoholic liquor in the premises described in such revoked license or in any other business establishment within the city. Such revocation, however, shall not affect or apply to new or different owners of those premises, provided

that the person or persons whose license has been revoked is (are) or do (does) not remain a beneficial owner or owners or any operator or operators of said premises.

<u>Section 8.</u> That Title 2, Business & License Regulation, Chapter 3, Liquor Control, Section 2-3-24, Sale of Kegs, of the Prospect Heights City Code, as amended, is hereby stricken in its entirety.

<u>Section 7.</u> That Title 2, Business & License Regulation, Chapter 3, Liquor Control, Section 2-3-26, Penalties, of the Prospect Heights City Code, as amended, is hereby with deletions in strikethrough and additions in bold underline text so that the same shall be read as follows:

2-3-26: PENALTIES:

- A. The penalties for a violation of any licensing provision of this chapter or any condition of a license issued under this chapter shall be the maximum allowed under section 7-5 of the Illinois Liquor Control Act of 1934, as amended, 235 Illinois Compiled Statutes 5/7-5.
- B. The penalty for violation of the social host provisions of this chapter shall be a fine no less than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) and not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00).

<u>Section 9.</u> This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as required by law.

Background:

Among the goals of the City of Prospect Heights is to ensure the proper collection of all taxes and fees of the City. This task presents challenges as the City encompasses properties with postal addresses of other communities. In order to conduct a necessary audit of these taxes and fees, outside contractual assistance is necessary.

Analysis:

Staff interviewed two firms which specialize in this service. Azavar is recommended. The Company will conduct an audit of taxes and fees due to the City. Payment to the Company is based upon recovered revenues. This contingency fee structure provides Azavar with 45 per cent of new revenues recovered by the audit process.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends this agreement with Azavar for the auditing and recovery of taxes and fees due the City of Prospect Heights.

CONTINGENT FEE PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Professional Services Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between Azavar Audit Solutions, Incorporated, an Illinois corporation having its principal place of business at 55 East Jackson Boulevard, Suite 2100, Chicago, Illinois 60604 ("Azavar"), and the City of Prospect Heights an Illinois municipal corporation having its principal place of business at 8 North Elmhurst Road, Prospect Heights, Illinois 60070 ("Customer").

1. SCOPE OF SERVICES

- 1.1 Subject to the following terms and conditions, Azavar shall provide professional computer, data audit, compliance management, and management consulting services ("Services") in accordance with the below statement of work. Azavar will render the services provided under this Agreement in a workmanlike manner in accordance with industry standards. The services and work provided shall be provided in substantial accordance with the below statements.
 - Azavar shall undertake a Municipal Audit Program on behalf of the Customer. As part of the Municipal Audit Program Azavar shall, on behalf of the Customer, separately review and audit each fee, ordinance, contract, franchise agreement, utility tax, locally administered taxes or fees, locally imposed occupation tax, ad valorem tax, excise tax, taxpayer, franchise fee, utility service fee, intergovernmental or other remittances to the Customer, and expense imposed by or upon the Customer within the Customer's corporate boundaries ("Audits") including, but not limited to local businesses, electric, gas, cable, telecommunications, refuse, and water providers ("Providers") on behalf of the Customer. Azavar shall review during the course of its work for the Customer, Customer ordinances, contracts, receipts, addresses and databases, including any of the aforementioned items, whether administered locally, by the state or federal government, by any other government or non-government organization, or by any other third-party, revenues relating to state and local sales/use/occupation taxes, including amusement taxes, business license/registration databases and revenue, and any other locally authorized fees and/or licenses, including liquor licenses. Azavar shall review and audit, food, beverage, and/or liquor taxes and/or fees and hotel, bed, and/or transient occupancy taxes where applicable to the Customer. Azavar shall review and consult Customer on areas to enhance, increase, or maximize Customer revenues including, but not limited to, previous, existing, or new ordinances, agreements, or third-party contracts. Should the Customer own or operate its own utilities including electric, natural gas, water or other utilities, Azavar shall also review and audit the revenues, , and expenses of those Customer owned or operated utilities.
 - The purpose of each audit is to determine past, present, and future taxes, franchise fees, service fees, or any other recoveries, refunds, (b) monies or revenue owed to the Customer that were not properly attributed to the Customer or were not properly paid or collected and to determine future taxes, franchise fees, and other monies owed to the Customer not previously counted so that Customer can collect these past, present, and future monies. Federal and Illinois state law, the Customer's own local ordinances and databases, and the franchise agreements, contracts or bills between Customer and Providers are used by Azavar to conduct the Audits and Azavar will present to Customer in writing during the course of the Audits findings of monies paid, due, or potentially due to the Customer for review by the Customer ("Findings"). Where already allowable by existing Customer contracts or agreements or Federal, State, or local laws or ordinances, this Agreement authorizes Azavar to correct any prospective errors and make a reasonable effort to collect monies due to the Customer under such applicable laws, local ordinances, or contracts. Azavar shall review Customer ordinances and shall present Findings to Customer to maximize Customer revenues as part of the Audits, and where such Findings requires a change into the future, Azavar will only implement such change after Customer has reviewed and agreed to in writing any such change. Customer understands that Findings may include, but are not limited to, changes to technology, organizational processes, process automation, Customer communication practices, Customer governing practices, and/or updates to local ordinances or the codification thereof. Customer agrees that any Findings, whether implemented in whole or in part by Azavar or the Customer, shall be fully compensable under Section 3 of this Agreement, including wherein the Findings require any amendments to an ordinance and wherein the ordinance is changed. Customer agrees to review any Findings within thirty (30) days.
 - (c) Customer hereby represents that it is not engaged in any Audits as contemplated under this Agreement and shall therefore pay Azavar the fees set forth in this Agreement for any Findings made by Azavar. Customer agrees that it shall not initiate or engage in any Audits, changes to any ordinances related to any Audits, or execution or renewal of any contracts or franchise agreements related to any Audits as contemplated under this Agreement without Azavar's prior written consent.
 - (d) In order to perform the Audits, Azavar shall require full access to Customer records and Provider records. Customer shall use its authority as necessary to assist in acquiring information and procure data from Providers. Customer agrees that it shall cooperate with Azavar, provide any documentation and records requested by Azavar, and provide continued access (prior to, during, and following any Audits) to documentation and records, and shall engage in meetings with Providers when requested by Azavar. Customer shall notify Azavar of any Provider requested meetings with Customer and shall include Azavar in said meetings.
 - (e) During the course of each audit, Azavar may find that rather than being owed past due funds, the Customer owes funds erroneously paid to the Customer. In this case, Azavar will immediately terminate its participation for that specific Provider audit at no cost to the Customer and will document the error and provide the Customer with information necessary to correct the error. Azavar shall have no liability to Customer for these errors or actions arising from Azavar's or Customer's knowledge thereof.
 - (f) Customer acknowledges that each Provider is a separate entity that is not controlled by Azavar and therefore Azavar cannot predict all the steps or actions that a Provider will take to limit its responsibility or liability during the audit. Should Customer negotiate, abate, cancel, amend, delay, or waive by any means all or a portion of funds identified as payable to Customer during an audit, Customer shall pay all Azavar expenses and fees on a time and materials basis for that audit in addition to any applicable contingency fees for any Findings that were identified by Azavar or by its Audits;
 - (g) The first audit start date is expected to be within no later than thirty (30) days from the date of this Agreement unless changed and approved by the Customer's Audit Primary Contact and Liaison;
 - (h) Each audit is expected to last at least six (6) months. Each subsequent audit will begin after payment terms and obligations have been satisfactorily met from previously completed Audits however overlapping audit work may take place at the discretion of Azavar. Audit timelines are set at the discretion of Azavar;

- (i) Audit status meetings will be held regularly via phone, email, or in person throughout the course of the Audits between Azavar and the Customer's Primary Contact and Liaison and will occur approximately every quarter;
- (j) Jason Perry, Municipal Audit Program Manager, and Azavar specialists will be auditors under this agreement. All Azavar staff or subcontractors shall be supervised by the Azavar Program Manager.
- 1.2 Customer agrees to provide reasonable facilities, space, desks, chairs, telephone and reasonably necessary office supplies for Consultants working on Customer's premises as may be reasonably required for the performance of the Services set forth in this Agreement and in any Exhibit hereto. Customer will assign and designate an employee to be the Audit Primary Contact and Liaison. The Customer's Audit Primary Contact and Liaison will be the final decision maker for the Customer as it relates to this audit and will meet with Azavar staff on a regular basis as necessary. Lack of participation of Customer staff, especially at critical milestones during an audit, will adversely affect the audit timeline and successful recovery of funds. Customer's staff shall be available for meetings and participation with Providers to properly verify records and recover funds.
- 2. <u>INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR</u>. Azavar acknowledges and agrees that the relationship of the parties hereunder shall be that of independent contractor and that neither Azavar nor its employees shall be deemed to be an employee of Customer for any reason whatsoever. Neither Azavar nor Azavar's employees shall be entitled to any Customer employment rights or benefits whatsoever. Customer shall designate Azavar as Power of Attorney with the Illinois Department of Revenue solely for the purpose of reviewing data provided by the Illinois Department of Revenue.

3. PAYMENT TERMS.

- 3.1 Customer shall compensate Azavar the fees set forth in this agreement on a contingency basis. If applicable, Azavar shall submit an invoice to Customer on a monthly basis detailing the amounts charged to Customer pursuant to the tenns of this Agreement. Any invoice not disputed in writing by Customer within thirty (30) days after the receipt of such invoice shall be considered approved by the Customer. Customer shall remit payment to Azavar in accordance with the Local Government Prompt Payment Act. If Customer defaults on payment of any invoice that is not disputed in writing by Customer within thirty (30) days after the receipt of such invoice Azavar, at its discretion, may accelerate all payments due under this Agreement and seek recovery of all estimated fees due to Azavar based on Findings. Azavar shall be entitled to recover all costs of collection including, but not limited to, finance charges, interest at the rate of one percent (1%) per month, reasonable attorney's fees, court costs, and collection service fees and costs for any efforts to collect fees from the customer. Contingency payment terms are outlined below. If Customer negotiates, abates, cancels, amends, delays, or waives, without Azavar's written consent, any tax determination or Findings that were identified by Azavar or by its Audits where such Findings were allowed under the law at the time the tax determination or Findings were made, Customer shall pay to Azavar applicable contingency fees for the total said tax determination or Findings at the rates set forth below and for the following thirty-six (36) months. If Customer later implements during the subsequent thirty-six (36) months any Findings Customer initially declined based on Azavar programs or recommendations, Azavar shall be paid by Customer its portion of the savings and/or recoveries over the following thirty-six (tenty-four months at the contingency fee rates set forth below.
- 3.2 Customer shall pay Azavar an amount equal to forty-five (45) percent of any new revenues or prospective funds recovered per account or per Provider for thirty-six (36) months following when funds begin to be properly remitted to the Customer. In the event Azavar is able to recover any retroactive funds, any additional savings or revenue increases for any time period, or any credits at any time, Customer will pay Azavar an amount equal to forty-five (45) percent of any retroactive funds, savings, and fair market value for any other special consideration or compensation recovered for or received by the Customer from any Provider. All contingency fees paid to Azavar are based on determinations of recovery by Azavar including Provider data and regulatory filings. All revenue after the subsequent thirty-six (36) month period for each account individually will accrue to the sole benefit of the Customer.
- 3.3 As it pertains to Customer expenses, utility service bill and cost Audits, Customer shall pay Azavar an amount equal to forty-five (45) percent of prospective savings approved by Customer for thirty-six (36) months following the date savings per Provider is implemented by Azavar or Customer. In the event Azavar is able to recover any refunds or any credits at any time, Customer will pay Azavar an amount equal to forty-five (45) percent of said refunds or credits recovered for or received by Customer from any Provider. All contingency fees paid to Azavar are based on determinations of savings by Azavar including Provider data and regulatory filings. All savings after the subsequent thirty-six (36) month period for each service provider individually will accrue to the sole benefit of the Customer.

4. CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION

- 4.1 Each party acknowledges that in the performance of its obligations hereunder, either party may have access to information belonging to the other which is proprietary, private and highly confidential ("Confidential Information"). Each party, on behalf of itself and its employees, agrees not to disclose to any third party any Confidential Information to which it may have access while performing its obligations hereunder without the written consent of the disclosing party which shall be executed by an officer of such disclosing party. Confidential Information does not include: (i) written information legally acquired by either party prior to the negotiation of this Agreement, (ii) information which is or becomes a matter of public knowledge, (iii) information which is or becomes available to the recipient party from third parties where such third parties have no confidentiality obligations to the disclosing party; and (iv) information subject to disclosure under Illinois' Freedom of Information Act (5 ILCS 140/1 et seq.).
- 4.2 Azavar agrees that any work product or any other data or information that is provided by Customer in connection with the Services shall remain the property of Customer, and shall be returned promptly upon demand by Customer, or if not earlier demanded, upon expiration of the Services provided under the Statement of Work hereto.

5. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

- 5.1 No work performed by Azavar or any Consultant with respect to the Services or any supporting or related documentation therefor shall be considered to be a Work Made for Hire (as defined under U.S. copyright law) and, as such, shall be owned by and for the benefit of Azavar. In the event that it should be determined that any of such Services or supporting documentation qualifies as a "Work Made for Hire" under U.S. copyright law, then Customer will and hereby does assign to Azavar, for no additional consideration, all right, title, and interest that it may possess in such Services and related documentation including, but not limited to, all copyright and proprietary rights relating thereto. Upon request, Customer will take such steps as are reasonably necessary to enable Azavar to record such assignment. Customer will sign, upon request, any documents needed to confirm that the Services or any portion thereof is not a Work Made for Hire and/or to effectuate the assignment of its rights to Azavar.
- 5.2 Under no circumstance shall Customer have the right to distribute any software containing, or based upon, Confidential Information of Azavar to any third party without the prior written consent of Azavar which must be executed by a senior officer of Azavar.
- 5.3 Customer agrees that it shall use and participate in pilot or beta testing of Azavar developed, hosted, managed, and supported software pertaining to local government expense management, tax location management, tax filing and payment applications for locally authorized and/or administered taxes or fees, and revenue monitoring, management, and reporting software ("Azavar Software"). Customer agrees that it shall, within no more than six (6) months from the date of execution of this Agreement, provide Azavar information necessary to deploy Azavar Software, including, but not limited to, the portions of Azavar Software that provide for electronic filing and payment of locally authorized and/or administered taxes or fees such that the Azavar Software shall be available on Customer's official website and accessible to users of Customer's website in a live and secure production environment. Azavar shall provide Customer a draft ordinance, which Customer agrees to present to its locally elected body politic for consideration and adoption wherein said ordinance shall require, within no more than twelve (12) months from adoption of the ordinance ("Enactment Date"), that all locally authorized and/or administered taxes or fees supported by Azavar Software shall only be filed and paid electronically by fee or taxpayers using Azavar Software and that Customer shall only accept filing and payment of all locally authorized and/or administered taxes or fees electronically following the Enactment Date and in accordance with the terms of the then applicable End User License Agreement(s). Customer agrees that any and all such software, including Azavar Software, is the property of Azavar and that Customer will provide Azavar feedback in writing regarding the features and function of Azavar Software. Customer agrees to respond in writing within thirty (30) days to any Azavar written requests for Customer feedback pertaining to Azavar Software. Unless otherwise agreed and attached hereto as an amendment to this Agreement, Azavar shall provide Customer access and use of any Azavar provided software at no charge for a period of no less than six (6) months and not to exceed twelve (12) months, at which time Customer and Azavar shall negotiate and agree to licensing and fees.

6. **DISCLAIMER**





No retail liquor dispenser may employ a manager without first filing a "Statement of Manager" with the City Collector, the length of time a person may act as manager has no bearing on this requirement, the manager must possess the same qualifications as the license.

Chapter 3 Section 2-3-18 (b-1) City Code provides that no licensee or any employee of a licensee shall:

- Solicit, induce or request any patron of the licensed establishment to purchase any alcoholic or non-alcoholic beverage for himself or any other employee of the licenses establishment;
- B. Section 2-3-18 (B-2) City Code prohibits any licensee from knowingly serving any employee any alcoholic or non-alcoholic beverage which was purchased by any patron.

Chapter 3 Section 2-3-18 (8-5) City Code provides that the ticensee shall not permit employees engaging in prohibited practices to remain on premises. No licensee, manager or barkeeper of a licensed establishment solicits, induces or requests a patron to purchase an alcoholic or non-alcoholic beverage for any employee. Nothing in this ordinance prohibits the above activities where the patron and employee are related by blood or marriage,

Pinball, bagatelle or pigeonhole games are permitted with appropriate licensing as provided by the City Code of Prospect Heights.

Refusal to cooperate with any investigation pertaining to the licensed premises could result in suspension or revocation of the license issued for operation of subject location.

Joe,

In the budget for this fiscal year is \$135,000 for the replacement of the Public Works backhoe. This machine is used for digging deep holes and trenches for water main repairs and section replacements. It is also used for storm pipe and sewer dig requirements. Our current unit is a 1991 Ford 655C Xtra-tator. This has been a good machine but now with 27 years of use it is tired. Replacement parts are no longer produced and if it has a major failure it will have little trade or resale value.

I have researched and obtained quotes from different vendors offering comparable equipment. The 1991 Ford has proven to be a good fit for the tasks and projects we have worked over the years. The mechanical specifics were the baseline criteria for a replacement. Prices below are the total expense after trade in-

- ---Caterpillar-Patten Cat \$109,835.00
- ---John Deere- West Side Tractor \$95,802.50
- --- Case McCann Industries \$93,556.96

After reviewing each quote and comparing equipment, service, reliability reports, and price I recommend the purchase of the <u>Case 580 Super N from McCann Industries</u>. I have attached Cover sheets for each machine reviewed. There are a couple equipment options that were not part of the original quote. I expect that will be around \$4,800. I am asking for approval to purchase this replacement backhoe with accessories not to exceed \$100,000.





SPECIAL PROVISIONS

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STATE OF ILLINOIS

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

The following Special Provisions supplement the Illinois Department of Transportation's (IDOT) "Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction," adopted April 1, 2016, (hereinafter referred to as the "Standard Specifications"); the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways" the "Manual of Test Procedures of Materials", in effect on the date of invitation for bids; the "Supplemental Specifications and Recurring Special Provisions," latest edition as indicated on the Check Sheet included herein, and Standard Specifications for Water and Sewer Main construction in Illinois latest edition which apply to and govern the improvements construction of the CCTV of Sanitary Sewers in the City. In case of conflict with any part or parts of the Standard Specifications, these Special Provisions shall take precedence and shall govern.

LOCATION OF PROJECT

The project is located at various locations within the City limits of The City of Prospect Heights. A location map of the general location of various sewers is included in the specifications.

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT

The work consists of closed circuit televising, cleaning and other associated work of sanitary sewers in the City and all other items associated with the work identified in the bidding documents for the CCTV of sanitary sewers in the City. The contract has a base bid consisting of 130,000 of sanitary sewer.

MAINTENANCE OF ROADWAYS

Effective: September 30, 1985 Revised November 1, 1996

Beginning on the date that the Contractor begins work on this project, he shall assume responsibility for normal maintenance of all existing roadways within the limits of the improvement. This normal maintenance shall include all repair work deemed necessary by the Engineer, but shall not include snow removal operations. Traffic control and protection for maintenance of roadways will be provided by the Contractor as required by the Engineer.

If items of work have not been provided for in the contract, or otherwise specified for payment, such items, including the accompanying traffic control and protection required by the Engineer, will be paid for in accordance with Article 109.04 of the Standard Specifications.

TRAFFIC CONTROL PLAN

Traffic Control shall be in accordance with the applicable sections of the Standard Specifications, the Supplemental Specifications, the "Illinois Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways", any special details and Highway Standards contained in the plans, and the Special Provisions contained herein.

City of Prospect Heights CCTV of Sanitary Sewers in City Cook County, Illinois

This item shall include all costs required to provide sufficient traffic control on all streets and easements during CCTV operations. This should include, but is not limited to barricades as necessary to ensure a safe work area and to protect all open trenches, road closed ahead signs as needed to adequately inform the motoring public of all road closures, and all traffic control required by the MUTCD and other State and Federal agencies. This work shall also traffic control as required by the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT), Cook County Highway Department (CCHD) and all other agencies with jurisdiction. The contract shall notify Police agencies of all road closures and such.

Basis of Payment. This work shall be paid for at the contract unit price per LUMP SUM for TRAFFIC CONTROL AND PROTECTION. SPECIAL

WORKING HOURS

The Contractor shall perform all work in the City of Prospect Heights as follows:

7:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M. Monday through Saturday

No work will be permitted on Sundays or holidays or at other times outside the above working hours without permission of the Engineer.

PROSECUTION AND PROGRESS

The start date for this project will be set forth in the Notice to Proceed following contract execution. The project shall be substantially completed by October 31, 2018 including all punch list items.

Should the Contractor fail to complete all work by this date, the Contractor shall be liable to pay the City liquidated damages per calendar day in accordance with the Standard Specifications.

ORDER OF WORK

A common sense order of work for this project is critical. Attached to these specifications are sanitary sewer atlas maps. These maps are the best available data which the City has on record. There may be sewer lines shown on these maps that will not be televised and there may be additions to these maps.

The City will work with the contractor to identify sewer lines to be videotaped prior to any field work being performed. The City will select the sewers to be televised. As the map shows, many of these sewers are located in easements, alley, rear yards, streets, parkways and other locations. Limited and/or difficult access to some of the sewer lines will be required. This includes dead end lines and lines located in easements and utility corridors. The contractor is responsible for all notification to residents as needed to complete the work. Any damage to existing hardscape, landscape areas and/or other areas shall be repaired to the satisfaction of the City at the sole cost to the contractor.

The City would generally like the sewers to be televised starting on the West side of the City and working the way towards the East (downstream). In any case, the contractor will not be allowed to jump all around the City to different sewer segments in any back and forth kind of fashion. The plan and progress of all work shall be very orderly to ensure ease in reviewing videos and such. The City needs to approve all work sequencing with the contractor, prior to work being done. The schedule and sequence of work shall be updated twice per month and will be closely monitored by the Engineer and City.

In addition, the City (through there GIS department) will provide the contractor with sewer maps, including sewer manhole numbering system. The sewer manhole numbering system (or address reference) {as required by City} is required and shall be referenced in the external hard drive, audio and reports for each segment.

City of Prospect Heights CCTV of Sanitary Sewers in City Cook County, Illinois

WATER USAGE

Water will be available, at no cost, to the contractor for all approved construction activities such as filling new mains, flushing, jetting of trenches, and washing of City streets. The contractor must use a meter from the Building Department and/or an approved meter of his own, with backflow preventor, when using water from City hydrants. It is the contractor's responsibility to measure (meter) the quantity of water used during construction operations. The quantity of water used in gallons, shall be reported to the City on a monthly basis. The cost of such work is incidental to the contract.

TELEVISED INSPECTION OF SEWERS

I. STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS

- 1.1. The applicable Standard Specifications, as herein specified, shall apply to all work and materials performed under this contract unless revised by the Specifications, also herein included as part of these documents.
- 1.2. The "Standard Specifications for Water and Sewer Main Construction in Illinois", fifth edition, dated May, 2014, and all revisions thereto shall govern all sewer and watermain construction work performed on this project. Copies of these standard specifications are on file with the engineer for inspection or may be obtained from the following:
 - A. Illinois Society of Professional Engineers
 - B. 612 South Second Street
 - C. Springfield, Illinois 62704
- 1.3. The "Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction" prepared by the State of Illinois Department of Transportation and adopted by said Department on April 2, 2016; the "Standard Specifications for Traffic Control Items of the State of Illinois, Department of Transportation", and the "Illinois Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways", as adopted by the Illinois Department of Transportation including all applicable supplemental specifications and revisions, shall govern all street paving and storm sewer construction. A copy of these "Standard Specifications" are on file with the Engineer for inspection.

2. PERSONNEL EXPERIENCE AND SUPERVISION

2.1. The Contractor shall furnish trained personnel with at least five years experience in the field of sewer cleaning and televising inspection to responsibly complete the specified work. The number of personnel provided shall be adequate to properly and safely complete the work to the satisfaction of the Engineer. The work crew shall also include an experienced trained supervisor to direct the activities of the other personnel and to actively represent the interest of the Contractor.

3. SEWER CLEANING

- 3.1. General
- 3.2. The Contractor shall provide all labor, materials, and equipment to clean the sewers specified to be cleaned by the Contract Documents. Sewer cleaning is defined as the removal of all foreign materials from the pipe system so as to restore the hydraulic capacity to within ninety-five percent (95%) of the theoretical carrying capacity. Generally this performance will be considered to be achieved when all loose debris and deposits, and all tree roots exceeding four inches (4") in length have been removed.
- 3.3. Prior to jet cleaning, the upstream manhole cover must be removed and replaced with an open grate cover or be barricaded. If barricades are used it is the responsibility of the Contractor to make the area safe. This procedure will prevent a vacuum from forming in the pipeline when jetting, preventing the water column in building traps from being siphoned out.
- 3.4. An **initial cleaning** shall be attempted using the high-pressure jet cleaning equipment mounted on an appropriate sized skid (incidental to pay items). Should this initial cleaning indicate that no major obstructions (roots or collapsed pipe) exist, and if necessary and as approved by the Engineer, the cleaning shall continue with a light cleaning as approved by Engineer of City, as defined elsewhere in the specifications.

- 3.5. The Contractor must have appropriate size skids and root cutting heads on all rodding trucks. Rodding work performed without the proper equipment will not be accepted or paid. All equipment shall be approved prior to the start of each day by the City or the City's Representative. Fallure to have the appropriate tools and equipment may result in termination of this contract.
- 3.6. Should the initial cleaning indicate a collapsed pipe, the cleaning effort shall be abandoned and the City representative notified immediately. The City will be responsible to repair all existing point repairs within the sewers (not sewers damaged by contractor).

4. Protection of Sewer System

4.1. The Contractor shall, during cleaning and televising operations, take precautions so as to not damage the manhole structures or pipe sections. Damaged portions of the sewer system, if determined by the Engineer to be the result of careless operations, shall be repaired at the expense of the Contractor. All identified unstable or unsound parts of the sewer system shall be documented and brought to the attention of the Engineer.

5. Equipment

- 5.1. The cleaning equipment to be used in this operation shall be based in the specific conditions identified. The equipment shall be capable of removing dirt, sand, grease, rocks, bricks, tree roots, and other deleterious materials and obstructions commonly found in sewer pipelines. The equipment shall be heavy-duty municipal or industrial grade with a powered unit capable of cleaning in one section, up to 1,000 lineal feet of sewer from a single access point. The equipment shall be able to pull brushes, swabs, and other implements and shall also have a distance meter so that the location of the cleaning tools can be determined at all times.
- 5.2. All equipment used by the Contractor shall be designed to avoid damage to the sewer system. The Contractor shall be solely responsible for any damage caused to the sewer system by his activities and shall make all such repairs at his own expense to the satisfaction of the City.
- 5.3. High-pressure hydro-cleaning equipment, such as jet cleaning or jet rodders, shall have a selection of high velocity nozzles. These nozzles shall be approved prior to the start of the contract and prior to the start of each day by the City's representative to insure that the equipment is present to do the necessary work that day. The nozzles shall be capable of producing a scouring action from 15 degrees to 45 degrees in all size lines designated to be cleaned. The City's representative shall inform the Contractor if he feels the nozzles jets are worn in such a way that the scouring pattern is not moving the debris down the pipeline. The cleaning equipment shall have a high pressure pump capable of producing a minimum of 65 gallons per minute at a minimum pressure of 2000 psi. The equipment shall also have a minimum of 1,000 feet of high-pressure jet hose and a high-pressure gun for washing and scouring manhole walls and floor. All cleaning equipment shall be equipped with a pentagon type wrench, a two inch hydrant adapter with a shut off valve and proper check valves or air gap to prevent a cross connection.

6. Waste Material Disposal

6.1. The Contractor is to remove and dispose of all waste material extracted during the sewer cleaning operation in a proper waste disposal facility. The material developed during the cleaning operation shall be removed at the next downstream manhole. Passing material over extended distances, from manhole section to manhole section, which would cause service line blockages or otherwise deter the operation of the sewer system will not be

permitted. The Contractor shall note the approximate volume and type of materials removed from each cleaned section. All this work is incidental to the contract and other contract pay items.

7. Water Usage

7.1. The Contractor must make all arrangements to obtain the water required for cleaning and other activities associated with this Contract from sources of his own selection. The City will permit and supply water (water at no charge) to the contractor for all approved work on this contract. The City will designate multiple points for water access (within the City) and specify terms for such use. It is the contractor's responsibility to obtain water, transport, etc. as needed to complete the work, all in accordance with City standards and requirements. All water shall be metered and shall have a backflow preventor. The amount of water used on a weekly basis shall be reported to the City. All permit/fees for the water meter will be borne by the Contractor. The City will not charge for the water used for approved construction activities.

8. Sewer Cleaning Operations

- 8.1. The sewer cleaning has been divided into two categories to address the general level of difficulty often encountered in sewers. The first category is *light duty cleaning*. Such cleaning involves the removal of all sludge, dirt, sand, rock, grease, light root growth, and other solid and semi-solid materials with such hydraulic or mechanically powered equipment such as balls, scooters, brushes, cutters, and water pressure jetting equipment.
- 8.2. Where it is found that large deposits or debris or extensive root growth exists within the sewer lines, and upon approval of the Engineer, heavy duty cleaning will be used to clear the specified section. This operation will generally involve the use of bucket machines, scrapers, augers, and special cutters, and 120 gpm high pressure jetting equipment. When this cleaning level is used, caution should be exercised to avoid damage to the sewer. All measures should be considered to prevent the equipment from becoming lodged in the pipe, necessitating excavation to extract the implement.
- 8.3. If cleaning of an entire section cannot be successfully performed from one manhole setup position, the equipment shall be reset on the next adjacent manhole and the cleaning again attempted, If again the sewer section cannot be satisfactorily cleaned, or the equipment fails to traverse the problem section, it will be assumed that a major blockage exists and the cleaning shall be suspended in this section until other measures can be arranged.

9. TELEVISING INSPECTION

9.1. General

A. After cleaning of designated pipe sections (if required and approved by Engineer), or where otherwise required by the Engineer, the Contractor shall provide all labor, materials, and equipment necessary to visually inspect sewers by means of a closed-circuit television system.

9.2. Equipment

- A. The television camera used for the inspection shall be one specifically designed and constructed for such sewer inspection. The camera shall be equipped with a rotating imaging unit for viewing lateral connections, defects, and other objects discovered in the sewer. In this respect the camera shall have a high resolution lens capable of spanning a 360-degree circumference and 270-degrees on a horizontal axis. The focal length shall be adjustable through a range of one inch to infinity. Lighting for the camera unit shall be suitable to allow a clear picture for the entire periphery of the pipe. The camera shall be operative in 100% humidity conditions.
- B. The camera unit shall be able to tilt and rotate to see all service lateral connections and to "look up" the lateral. Every service lateral shall be televised as part of the main line sewer televising and shall include logging the station, the direction, the lateral size and tilt the camera toward service wye or tee and focus on service condition. This work shall be considered incidental to the lineal foot contract price for the main line sewer televising.
- C. The Contractor shall have equipment that is adaptable for use in the pipe size ranges included under the Contract. The Contractor shall have available self-propelled crawler transport units for mounting the television camera, so that sewer segments, which prove inaccessible to standard cable, pulled inspection, can be accessed, and viewed.
- D. The camera, television monitor, and other components of the video system shall be capable of producing a minimum 350 line resolution color video picture. Picture quality and definition shall be to the satisfaction of the Engineer and if unsatisfactory, equipment shall be removed and no payment made for unsatisfactory inspection.

9.3. Inspection Procedure

- A. The inspection shall involve the visual observation of closed circuit television.

 The television camera shall be moved through the sewer at a rate of speed which will allow examination of all points of infiltration, cracked or crushed pipe, defective joints, misalignment in line or grade, location of all service connections and any defects which may appear, but in no case at a speed greater than 30 feet per minute.
- B. Whenever non-remote powered and controlled winches are used to pull the television camera through the line, telephone, or other, suitable means of communication shall be set up between the two (2) manholes of the section being inspected to insure good communication between members of the crew.

C. In sewers that, in the opinion of the Engineer, are flowing too full to obtain an accurate video record, the Contractor shall be required to install a device in the upstream manhole to partially or fully restrict the upstream sewage from flowing through the section of pipe tested. The length of time that the upstream flow can be partially or fully restricted shall be coordinated with the Owner and the Engineer. In any case, sewer flows shall not exceed those shown below for the respective line size, as measured in the manhole involved in televising. It is expected that the City will allow temporary plugging of some of the smaller diameter sewer mains to reduce the flow rate. This process must be approved by the City and monitored by the City. The cost for temporary plugging of sewer lines will be considered incidental to other pay items. Bypass pumping (if used and approved by the Engineer) will be paid for as extra work (it is anticipated that bypass pumping will not be used on this contract).

8"-10" Pipe
 15% of Pipe Diameter
 12"-24" Pipe
 Over 24" Pipe
 25% of Pipe Diameter

It is required that the contractor use "normal" techniques to draw down the amount of water in the sewer, such as the use of the nozzle, temporary plugs and/or other methods. The cost of all this work is incidental to other pay items.

- D. In sewers found to have sag sections, which in the opinion of the Engineer significantly obstruct the view of the internal surfaces of the pipe, the pipe segment shall be pumped so as to remove a sufficient amount of waste water to complete a satisfactory inspection. Similar procedures to that used in those sections found to have high flows shall be applied in this circumstance.
- E. Manual winches, power winches, TV cable, and powered rewinds or other devises that do not obstruct the camera view or interfere with proper documentation of the sewer conditions shall be used to move the camera through the sewer line. If, during the inspection operation the television will not pass through the entire manhole section, the Contractor shall re-set up his equipment. If, again, the camera fails to pass through the entire manhole section, the inspection shall be considered complete and no additional inspection work will be required, unless specifically requested by the Engineer.

9.4. Accuracy of Distance Record

A. The measurements made during the course of the internal inspection must be reasonably accurate for future use in making sewer repairs and adjustments. Measurement meter records shall be accurate to within one half (0.5') over the length of the section being inspected. Accuracy of the measurements shall be checked daily with a steel or fiberglass tape. The distance between manhole structures shall be determined for each section inspected, and noted in the record. The televised equipment operators shall physically measure the distance between manholes, center to center, prior to completing the inspection, and record the information as part of the video tape and written record. The Engineer may from time to time, review these measurements with the operator to ensure reporting accuracy.

9.5. Television Record Format

A. The television record shall be recorded on standard 4.72 inch (4.72") digital videodisc media recordable (DVD+R).

Digital video recorders shall be able to capture in color form the live video source with the following minimum requirements.

- a) HQ-VCD MPEG1 requirements.
- b) Picture Size: NTSC 352 x 240 @ 29.97 frames per second.
- c) Data/Bit Rate: MPEG-1 @ 2.4 M-bits/second.

External hard drives shall be provided with all the data on them. Four external hard drives shall be provided at the conclusion of the project, with each containing 100% of the data, videos, reports and all associated work.

The format shall be easily readable. Each segment of sewer line shall be indexed and cataloged individually, so that access (viewing) to a specific sewer segment will be easy and in a fast and efficient manner.

The City is open to ideas, but easy, sensible and fast access to each sewer segment is critical to this project. The external hard drives shall have each sewer segment indexed and easily accessible.

- B. The visual portion of the video tape shall show the true picture of the inside of the sewer, with a metered image on the screen visually recording the precise location of wyes, service lateral connections, break-in connections, defective joints, cracked or crushed pipe and all other points of actual or potential infiltration. The screen image shall also provide data relative to the manhole section being viewed, distance, and the date of the recording.
- C. The audio portion of the video tape shall be the audio record in which the Contractor shall state the location of the pipe being viewed, condition of pipe, estimated infiltration at designated and recorded points, footage so that location can be established and any other pertinent information.

9.6. Interim Progress Report

A. In order to best monitor the progress being made, and to identify areas where operational problems have caused sewer segments to be inadvertently overlooked, an interim project progress report shall be prepared by the Contractor at mutually agreed upon intervals, generally every two weeks, but in no case greater than four weeks, which documents the work accomplished over the duration of the Contract. The interim report shall provide specific references to the sewer segments televised, indicating the manhole and pipe numbering system provided by the Engineer. The interim progress report shall document the work conducted under the Contact by listing the date and pipe section completed, and provide a summary of all work completed under the Contract. The form, which details the format for these tables, has been attached at the end of this section of the Contract Documents.

10. PROJECT REPORT

- 10.1. With the completion of the televised inspection survey, a project report shall be prepared by the Contractor, which identifies the findings of all televising activities. Specific references to the sections of the sewer system shall reflect the manhole and pipe numbering system provided by the Engineer (this might also be based upon street addresses). Four (4) copies of the report and external hard drives shall be submitted to the Engineer for review and distribution. The report and the external hard drives shall be delivered within thirty (30) days following the completion of the televising work, or on a date acceptable to the Owner. The report shall contain the findings of the televising work including the following:
- 10.2. A transcript of the video record indicating the precise location of each building service, pipe defect, infiltration source, area of heavy root infestation, pipe alignment problem, or any other unusual conditions observed. The service connection types should be identified (i.e. either service wyes or break-in type connections). Manhole to manhole distance measurements shall be noted with the record of each section inspected. The format of the transcript shall be submitted for approval by the Engineer.
- 10.3. Photographs of specific defects viewed on the television monitor shall be provided as part of the report to illustrate significant problems observed. Unless otherwise noted, the specific features photographed shall be documented at the direction of the Engineer.
- 10.4. Notes and dimensions updating or verifying the information shown in the reference map provided by the Engineer.
- 10.5. A tabular report, which indexes or catalogues the recorded video tape information associated with each sewer segment. Both a hard copy and an electronic (spreadsheet) copy shall be provided for use by the Owner and the Engineer. The form for this table has been included at the end of this section of the Contract Documents. In this reported information is defined as follows:
 - A. Tape #: Indicates the numerical reference for the tape, in a format that indicates survey year and a tape sequence number (e.g. 2009-5).
 - B. Operator: Indicates the initials of the trained personnel responsible for the televised inspection.
 - C. Date: Indicates the date of the televised inspection.
 - D. Location: Indicates the location of the sewer segment inspected, usually referenced by house address and/or intersection streets.
 - E. From-To: Indicates the assigned upstream manhole reference number and the downstream manhole reference number. (may be based on street addresses)
 - F. Length: Indicates the length of sewer segment physically measured from manhole to manhole, as confirmed by the observed length.
 - G. Pipe Size: Indicates the observed pipe size for the inspected segment.
 - H. Pipe Material: Indicates the observed pipe material type for the inspected segment.

- I. Comments: Provides any other information such as incomplete inspection due to obstruction or blockage, reverse setup required, root infestation, broken pipe, or pipe sag or offset joint alignment problems.
- 10.6. The submitted external hard drives shall present the video record conditions relative to schematic position in the sewer system, such that each cartridge shall contain contiguous sewer segments from the same sewer service area.
- 10.7. The television record shall be recorded on standard 4.72 inch (4.72") digital videodisc media recordable (DVD+R).

Digital video recorders shall be able to capture in color form the live video source with the following minimum requirements. The quality of all pictures will need to be approved by the Engineer.

LIGHT DUTY CLEANING (all sewer sizes)

A standard jet nozzle and appropriate sized skid with the high-pressure jet cleaning equipment shall be used for all sewer mains 12 inches and smaller in diameter. For all sewer mains from 15 inches to 21 inches the Contractor must use a culvert type cleaning head (Little Thunder) with the high-pressure jet cleaning equipment. For 24 inch sewer mains and larger the Contractor shall use a "Bull Dozer" type nozzle with the high-pressure jet cleaning machine (or other acceptable equipment). All nozzles shall be approved prior to the start of each day by the City or the City's representative. A minimum of two (2) passes and a maximum of four (4) passes using the high-pressure cleaning equipment will be made through each pipeline section. Light Duty cleaning needs to be approved by the Engineer or the City.

In those areas found to have excessive deposits of debris, roots, or other waste material, the Contractor, with the approval of the Engineer, shall utilize powerful, heavy duty equipment to clear the pipe line for internal inspection. Measurement of the actual number of feet cleaned shall be made from the center of the manholes.

Payment for this item shall be made at the Contract unit price per lineal foot for Light Duty Cleaning of Sewer, 8" to 18" including all cleaning equipment, manpower, removal and disposal of all extracted waste materials, water, and all other equipment and labor required to complete this item to the satisfaction of the Engineer.

HEAVY DUTY CLEANING (all sewer sizes)

If five to eight passes of the high-pressure jet cleaning equipment are made to sufficiently clean the pipeline, this section of pipeline will be considered to have undergone heavy cleaning. The City's representative will make the determination of how many passes are needed to completely clean the sewer.

Heavy Duty Cleaning shall only be used with the approval of the Engineer and when Light Duty Cleaning of Sewer line did was not sufficient. Measurement of the actual number of feet cleaned shall be made from the center of the manholes.

Payment for this item shall be made at the Contract unit price per lineal foot for Heavy Duty Cleaning of Sewer, 8" to 18" including all cleaning equipment, manpower, removal and disposal of all extracted waste materials, water, and all other equipment and labor required to complete this item to the satisfaction of the Engineer.

ROOT CLEANING

Specific sewer mains have been identified as having a root problem and the pipeline shall be cleaned using the appropriate sized root cutters and skid. All trucks MUST be equipped with root cutters and various size cutting heads and skids. The root cutting equipment shall be passed through the line a total of three to five times, and then flushed clean using the high-pressure jet cleaning equipment. Root cleaning will be incidental to either Light Cleaning or Heavy Duty Cleaning pay items.

CCTV INSPECTION OF SEWER, 8" TO 18" DIAMETER

The Contractor under the supervision of the Engineer, shall inspect the condition of the specified sewer pipe segments with a high resolution closed circuit television camera system drawn through the sewer by the mechanical, self propelled, floated, pulled, or other means as required. The inspection shall permit the clear examination of the pipe system and provide for the recording of all pertinent data as specified in the contract documents. Incidental to this item is an initial cleaning of the sewer as detailed in section 3.4 of the "Televised Inspection of Sewers" provision. Work also includes that all service lateral connections be televised (as part of the main line sewer work). This shall consist of logging the station, direction, lateral size, condition, etc. The camera shall tilt towards the service was or tee, focus and "look up" the sewer lateral. (Inspection inside each sewer lateral is not required.)

Payment for this item shall be made at the Contract unit price per lineal foot of CCTV Inspection of Sewer, 8" to 18" Diameter, including all television equipment, manpower, mobilization equipment, video recorders, and all other materials, equipment and labor required to complete this item to the satisfaction of the Engineer. A sewer segment is identified as that section from one manhole to another one for which the televising equipment has been set to inspect. This may include more than two manholes. If a blockage is encountered which physically prevents the passage of the T.V. camera, re-setting of the equipment's to enter from the opposite end manhole is required. This resetting of equipment will be at the option of the City Engineer, or his representative, who will be with the inspection team(s) on a daily basis. No compensation will be allowed for this resetting time or any associated time. If so ordered by the Engineer or his representative, additional attempts to re-set equipment will be paid for as extra work as defined in IDOT-SSRBC.

Prevailing Wage and Waiver Procedure

Prevailing Rate of Wages Notice and Requirements

The Contractor shall comply with the requirements of the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act (820 ILCS 130/0.01 et seq.) and the Owner's Ordinances requiring payment of prevailing wages. The Contractor shall pay or cause to be paid not less than the prevailing rate of hourly wage in the county the work is performed as determined by the Illinois Department of Labor for the month in which the work is performed including but not limited to all laborers, workers and mechanics. All contractors and subcontractors rendering services under this contract must comply with all requirements under the Act, including but not limited to, all wage, notice and record keeping duties.

The Contractor is required to verify current prevailing wage prior to the first day of each month and to pay the then-current prevailing wage rate as determined by the Illinois Department of Labor, regardless of the rates contained in the Contract Documents. Any increases in costs to the Contractor due to the changes in the prevailing wage during the term of this Contract shall be at the expense of Contractor and not at the expense of Owner. Current prevailing wage rates are published at the following website: http://www.state.il.us/agency/idol/Rates/EVENMO/COUNTY.HTM. The Contractor agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Owner for any violations of the Prevailing Wage Act.

The Contractor shall also: (1) insert into each subcontract and the project specifications for each subcontract, a written stipulation that the subcontractor shall not pay less than the prevailing rate of hourly wage to all laborers, workers, and mechanics performing work under the contract; and (2) require each subcontractor to insert into each lower-tiered contract and the project specifications for each lower-tiered subcontract, a stipulation that the subcontractor shall not pay less than prevailing rate of hourly wage to all laborers, workers, and mechanics performing work under the contract.

The Contractor shall include on all bonds and shall cause all subcontractors' bonds required under the Contract Documents to guarantee compliance with the Prevailing Wage Act.

Additionally, the Contractor and each subcontractor shall make and keep, for a period of not less than 3 years from the date of the last payment on a contract or subcontract, records of all laborers, mechanics, and other workers employed by them on the Project; the records shall include each worker's name, address, telephone number when available, social security number, classification or classifications, the hourly wages paid in each pay period, the number of hours worked each day, and the starting and ending times of work each day. The Contractor shall submit monthly, no later than the 10th day of each calendar month, in person, by mail, or electronically a certified payroll to the Owner with each monthly pay request in a form in accordance with the Prevailing Wage Act. The certified payroll shall be accompanied by a statement signed by the Contractor or subcontractor which states that: (i) he or she has examined the certified payroll and such records are true and accurate; (ii) the hourly rate paid to each worker is not less than the general prevailing rate of hourly wages required by this Act; and (iii) the Contractor or subcontractor is aware that filing a certified payroll that he or she knows to be

false is a Class A misdemeanor. The Contractor may rely on the certification of a lower tier subcontractor, provided the Contractor does not knowingly rely upon a subcontractor's false certification. The records submitted in accordance with this payroll submittal provision shall be considered public records pursuant to Section 5 of the Prevailing Wage Act, 820 ILCS 130/5 (2004, as amended by P.A. 94-515). The Owner may, at its option, immediately terminate the Contract in the event that Contractor violates any provision of this paragraph or the Prevailing Wage Act.

Contractor shall also post the prevailing wage rates for each craft or type of worker or mechanic needed to complete the project at either: (1) a location on the project site easily accessible to the workers engaged on the project; or (2) in lieu of posting on the project site, if the Contractor has a business location where laborers, workers, ands mechanics may regularly visit, the Contractor may either post the prevailing rate of wages in each county the Contractor works in a conspicuous location or provide the laborers, workers or mechanics engaged on the project a written notice indicating the prevailing rate of wages for the project.

Upon seven business days notice, the Contractor and each subcontractor shall make available for inspection and copying at a location within this State during reasonable hours, the records identified in 820 ILCS 130/5(a)(1) to the Owner, and its officers and agents.

Waiver Procedure/Format

Contractor's progress payment applications shall be accompanied by the Contractor's and Subcontractor's Partial Waiver of Lien to date for the full amount of the payment. The Final Waiver of the Contractor shall be for the full amount of the Contract and the Final Waiver of a Subcontractor shall be for he full amount of its Subcontract. All applications for payment shall be accompanied by affidavits from the Contractor, in triplicate, containing such information and in such form to comply with the Illinois Mechanics Lien Act (770 ILCS 60/001 et seq.) and showing in detail the sources of all labor and materials used and contracted to be used on the Project, including names and addresses of subcontractors and material suppliers, amounts paid and remaining to be paid to each, together with all other documents as shall be necessary, in the sole judgment of the Owner, to waive all claims of liens to date and comply with all applicable state and local laws.

All waivers (partial and final) shall include language as applicable indicating either that:

- 1. All materials were taken from fully paid stock and delivered to the job site in our own vehicles and all labor has been fully paid in accordance with prevailing wage laws; or
- 2. Materials were provided by the following suppliers from whom wavier of lien are attached and all labor has been fully paid in accordance with prevailing wage laws.

Note: The following certifications form an integral part of the Agreement between the Owner and Contractor. Breach by Contractor of any of the certifications may result in immediate termination of the Contractor's services by Owner.

THE UNDERSIGNED CONTRACTOR HEREBY ACKNOWLEDGES, CERTIFIES, AFFIRMS AND AGREES AS FOLLOWS:

- A. Contractor has carefully read and understands the contents, purpose and legal effect of this document as stated above and hereafter in this document. The certifications contained herein are true, complete and correct in all respects.
- B. Contractor shall abide by and comply with, and in contracts which it has with all persons providing any of the services or Work on this Project on its behalf shall require compliance with, all applicable Federal, State and local laws and rules and regulations including without limitation those relating to 1) fair employment practices, affirmative action and prohibiting discrimination in employment; 2) workers' compensation; 3) workplace safety; 4) wages and claims of laborers, mechanics and other workers, agents, or servants in any manner employed in connection with contracts involving public funds or the development or construction of public works, buildings or facilities; and 5) steel products procurement.
- C. All contracts for this Project are subject to the provisions of the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act (820 ILCS 130/0.01 et seq.), providing for the payment of the prevailing rate of wage to all laborers, workmen and mechanics engaged in the Work. Contractor shall pay prevailing rates of wages in accordance with the wage determination included with the Contract Documents and any subsequent determinations issued by the Illinois Department of Labor which shall supersede the determination included in the Contract Documents, all in accordance with applicable law. Contractor is responsible for determining the applicable prevailing wage rates at the time of bid submission and at the time of performance of the Work. Failure of Contractor to make such determination shall not relieve it of its obligations in accordance with the Contract Documents. Contractor shall also comply with all other requirements of the Act including without limitation those pertaining to inclusion of required language in subcontracts, job site posting, maintenance and submission of certified payroll records and inspection of records. Contractor is not barred from entering into public contracts under Section 11a of the Illinois Prevailing Wage Act due to its having been found to have disregarded its obligations under the Act.
- D. Pursuant to the Illinois Human Rights Act (775 ILCS 5/2-105), Contractor has a written sexual harassment policy that includes, at a minimum, the following information: (i) a

statement on the illegality of sexual harassment; (ii) the definition of sexual harassment under State law; (iii) a description of sexual harassment utilizing examples; (iv) the Contractor's internal complaint process including penalties; (v) the legal recourse, investigative and complaint process available through the Illinois Department of Human Rights and the Human Rights Commission and directions on how to contact both; and (vi) protection against retaliation as provided by Section 6-101 of the Illinois Human Rights Act. Contractor further certifies that such policy shall remain in full force and effect. A copy of the policy shall be provided to the Illinois Department of Human Rights upon request.

- E. Contractor shall abide by the "Employment of Illinois Workers on Public Works Act" (30 ILCS 570/0.01 et seq.) which stipulates that whenever there is a period of excessive unemployment in Illinois, defined as any month immediately following two (2) consecutive calendar months during which the level of unemployment in Illinois exceeds five percent (5%) as measured by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics in its monthly publication of employment and unemployment figures, the Contractor shall employ only Illinois laborers unless otherwise exempted as so stated in the Act. ("Illinois laborer" means any person who has resided in Illinois for at least 30 days and intends to become or remain an Illinois resident). Other laborers may be used if Illinois laborers are not available or are incapable of performing the particular type of work involved if so certified by the Contractor and approved by the Owner.
- F. (i) Contractor's bid proposal was made without any connection or common interest in the profits anticipated to be derived from the Contract by Contractor with any other persons submitting any bid or proposal for the Contract; (ii) the Contract terms are in all respects fair and the Contract will be entered into by Contractor without collusion or fraud; (iii) no official, officer or employee of the Owner has any direct or indirect financial interest in Contractor's bid proposal or in Contractor, (iv) the Contractor has not directly or indirectly provided, and shall not directly or indirectly provide, funds or other consideration to any person or entity (including, but not limited to, the Owner and the Owner's employees and agents), to procure improperly special or unusual treatment with respect to this Agreement or for the purpose of otherwise improperly influencing the relationship between the Owner and the Contractor. Additionally, the Contractor shall cause all of its officers, directors, employees, (as the case may be) to comply with the restrictions contained in the preceding sentence.
- G. 

Subject: Method of Collecting Delinquent Sewer Fees

Background:

Since adopting the increased sewer fee schedule last year, the amount of delinquent sewer bills has risen considerably and needs to be addressed.

Analysis:

The existing number of delinquent sewer accounts is harder to collect because we simply don't have the same leverage as we would with a water customer in being able to shut-off their services. As a result, the two most obvious choices for collecting delinquent accounts would be to file a lien or turn the matter over to collection. Although liens may be effective in some cases, I would be in favor of allowing us to turn the matter over to collection for the following reasons:

- 1. All collection fees can be added to the existing outstanding charges.
- 2. The resident is able to remit outstanding balances more quickly and avoid a mark against their credit;
- 3. Delinquent files are easy to provide to the collection agency when compared to the required forms and expense of filing a lien.

Recommendation:

I recommend that language be added to the City Code to allow delinquent sewer bills to be turned over to a collection agency 90 days after the original bill was issued. All collection fees incurred would be paid by the sewer customer and are in addition to their fees and late charges imposed by the City of Prospect Heights.
